TEXTBOOK/COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAM SELECTION AND ADOPTION

The Board of Education is responsible for the approval of all textbook/comprehensive program(s) to be used in the district schools. The Superintendent (or designee) facilitates the process for textbook/comprehensive program selection and adoption. The recommendation for district textbook/comprehensive program approval shall be forwarded to a sub-committee of the Board of Education (Outcomes and Assessment Sub-Committee) for review and discussion. Recommendations of the Outcomes and Assessment Sub-Committee shall go to the full Board of Education for final action.

Definition: Comprehensive Program

A comprehensive program is defined as an overarching course of study with a philosophical framework for the teaching-learning process. A program incorporates:

- A prescribed curriculum
- Connection to the NYS Learning Standards
- Evidence of research to support the effectiveness of the program
- Teaching guides for instruction
- Student materials and/or manipulatives
- Assessments
- Technology components
- Other relevant resources

Text/comprehensive program(s), once approved by the Board, shall not be superseded for a period of five years, except by a majority vote of the Board.

The teachers involved in the use of *textbook or comprehensive programs* will have a primary role in the selection of such materials. Appropriate personnel shall be appointed to textbook/*comprehensive program* selection and adoption committees following district procedures. The *Superintendent (or designee)* will work with the Central Administrative team and building level principals, grade levels, and departments to coordinate the timing and process of the committee's work.

The textbook/comprehensive program adoption committee will prepare a written report as an evaluation of the textbook/comprehensive program (SEE 4511-E). This report will be considered by the building principal/s, the Superintendent (or designee), and Central Administrative team before it is forwarded to the Board of Education's Sub-Committee on Outcomes and Assessment.

Definition: Supplemental Materials

The Superintendent (or designee) <u>retains the right to</u> select <u>appropriate</u> supplemental materials <u>as</u> needed for instruction. Supplemental materials are defined as items that support and enhance the teaching-learning process other than the textbook/comprehensive program or comprehensive program for the course or content area.

Once approval is granted by the Board of Education for the textbook/comprehensive program adoption, the building principal/s may proceed with allocating funds for purchasing the texts.
