**President's Remarks**

Vice-President Dr. Michael Buck welcomed everyone to tonight's meeting. He stated President Brian Lynch is out of town traveling, therefore, he will run tonight's meeting. He also stated that the minutes of the Special Meeting of August 11, 2011, will be presented to the Board for approval at the September meeting.

**Agenda Changes**

An Executive Session will be held directly after tonight's Regular Session to approve CSE/CPSE recommendations, and to discuss the employment history of two particular employees.

### **Awards, Honors and Recognition**

Dr. Ralph Marino recognized the following honors and achievements:

- Marilyn P. Morey, Leadership Development Manager of the New York State School Boards Association, acknowledged Brian Lynch, Alice Learn, Virginia Abrunzo and Jay Hillman, for the outstanding job they did helping new school board members understand the value of data. She expressed her tremendous thanks and appreciation to this fantastic team from the Horseheads Central School District who trained new school board members on the use of data at the New School Board Member Academy that was recently held in Corning and thanked the entire District for sharing the incredible ways that Horseheads uses data to make the best decisions for its District.
- Cory Sweet, a former Horseheads student who graduated this past June, was acknowledged in the Star-Gazette on August 7<sup>th</sup>. Cory is a leader of the sign-language ministry and is one of only 40 who have been accepted to study sign language this fall at the National Technical Institute for the Deaf at the Rochester Institute of Technology. Ralph is very proud of Cory's accomplishments.
- Christine Harkness, Middle School Special Education Teacher, is a recipient of the 2011-2012 Stanley Greenspan Memorial Scholarship. Ralph stated he is very proud of Chris being selected for this scholarship.
- Ralph shared a letter from the Energy Curtailment Specialists for the District's participation in PowerPay. The District was given a gift of ten trees to be planted in our honor along with a plaque. This state-wide program gives the District an opportunity to make a few thousand dollars through energy conservation.

Board Member Pam Strollo acknowledged Melanie Anastasio, High School Science Teacher, for her participation in the Teacher-Intern Pilot Program at Sullivan Park this summer. She took time out of her summer to participate in this program so that she will be able to increase the interest of students in STEM-related subjects and careers. It is wonderful that Melanie was willing to expand her experience and bring additional perspective into the classroom.

Board Member Mary Anne Holleran acknowledged Senior Parth Shah who is an exemplary product of the Horseheads Central School District. Parth has been acknowledged in the Star-Gazette once again. Parth was selected to represent New York's 29<sup>th</sup> Congressional District, working as a Capitol Page for six weeks this summer. Mary Anne is very proud of Parth's accomplishments.

**Superintendent’s Report**

**Update on District Initiatives**

Superintendent Dr. Ralph Marino presented the Board with an update on the District Initiatives. Ralph stated this is the second year of the 10-Year Strategic Plan. We are now in the Implementation Phase where there is a nice connection between the Board and the Implementation Team. Many parts of the work that was completed will roll over to this year. There have been some cuts in the area of Technology due to the budget. However, computers that are seven to ten years old will be replaced. The District is gearing up for the Professional Development piece of the Comprehensive ELA Approach/Process/Program for PreK-6. The Student Management Software System from SASI to School Tool Program is underway. This is a very large, comprehensive program that involves training for all the staff. Training has been on-going since April. Dr. Marino wanted the Board to take note of the Initiatives that have been completed over the past few years. It is very important that we don’t forget the work that we have accomplished.

Board Member John Lively inquired as to an update on the Full Day Pre-Kindergarten Pilot that was started on September 1, 2007, and at what point does it become part of our program so that it is no longer considered a pilot. Superintendent Dr. Marino stated that the Board has not made the policy decision where any child in the District can attend this program. In order to have this program as part of our curriculum, we need to have the space to house it and the finances to offer it to the full Horseheads community district-wide which we are unable to do so at this time.

He is very appreciative of Dr. Marino's commitment to the District and his willingness to accept inquires whether supportive or oppositional and explain his rationale for his decisions.

If this is the situation, Dr. Buck inquired as to how do we ensure that we do not cause social-economic hardship to anyone based on their status? Dr.

Marino stated that based on the results of the community survey last year, ninety-five percent of the families have internet access. He also stated at the beginning of the school year, the teachers could ask the students what their internet accessibility is.
