

INDOOR AIR QUALITY

The Board of Education recognizes the importance of providing safe and well-maintained facilities for use by students, staff, and residents. Therefore, the district has implemented an Indoor Air Quality Program to ensure a healthy work place for students and staff as recommended by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in the *Tools for Schools* guidelines.

The Superintendent of Schools shall initiate the development of an Administrative Regulation to outline procedures to coincide with the Indoor Air Quality Policy.
