

FOOD SERVICE MANAGEMENT

The Board of Education recognizes that school cafeterias are a part of the total school program. The Board shall, therefore, provide for adequate facilities, resources and personnel for the provision of food services for all elementary and secondary students in district schools.

The school district guidelines for reimbursable school meals shall not be less restrictive than regulations and guidance issued by state and federal law and regulations issued by the Secretary of Agriculture pursuant to subsections (1) and (b) of section 10 of the Child Nutrition Act. ~~(42 U.S.C. 1779) and section 9 (f)(1) and 17 (a) of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1758 (f)(1), 1766 (a) 0), as applied to school.~~

Food service management, including the procurement of food, the administration of free and reduced lunches, and the maintenance of an appropriate accounting of food service payments and charges, is the responsibility of the Food Services Director. The school food service should be operated in the most economical, efficient and satisfactory method given the student's needs and the district's resources.
