#### **Board President's Remarks**

President Lynch welcomed everyone tonight's Board Meeting. He stated it is always nice when the Board meets in the various schools throughout the District. He is looking forwards to Gardner Road's presentation.

#### **Agenda Changes**

President Lynch stated Agenda Item 6.3 – External Audit Report and Agenda Item 10.1 External Audit Report will be tabled until the October 22<sup>nd</sup> Board of Education Meeting. There will be an Executive Session to review CSE Recommendations and discussions regarding Collective Civil Service Negotiations.

#### **Questions and Comments from the Public**

Maureen Farrell, 366 Langdon Hill Road, Erin, presented the Board with a memo of continued concerns she has regarding the Proposed Schlumberger Gas Services' Facility. Mrs. Farrell stated she attended the last Board Meeting and listened attentively to the presentation by Glenn Harvey of Bergman Associates which addressed a number of her personal concerns. However, she stated there are still a number of significant issues which remain unresolved which she believes need to be addressed by the Board of Education, specifically those issues that involve the safety coordination and transportation planning related to this project.

Walter Hang, Ithaca, New York, stated recently he sent a letter to the Horseheads Central School District urging the District to investigate the possibility that the athletics fields are built over a contaminated site.

#### Awards, Honors and Recognition

Superintendent Ralph Marino recognized the following honors and achievements:

Superintendent Marino is very proud of Mr. Schrage and these students for giving up their time to clean up the Center.
- Ridge Road Grade 3 Teacher Kim Balliet, who was featured in a photo in the September 28<sup>th</sup> edition of the New York State School Boards Association's "On Board" publication of her "Recipe for Success" program. Superintendent Marino is very excited that Kim is doing this.
- Seniors Daniel Rodabuagh, Larissa Wagner and Erich Zhou on earning Student status in the 2001 National Merit Scholarship Program.
   Superintendent Marino is very proud of these students.
- Intermediate School Special Education Teacher Becky Schoonover on being awarded a \$250 grant for supplies through the Cellino and Barnes Scholarship program.

Assistant Superintendent Alice Learn recognized Instructional Technology Support Specialist Neva Kelly on being sought out by NASA for a new program that seeks to interest students across the nation in space exploration and space science. NASA began the program last year with four states and has expanded the program to three more states, including New York. Neva will help develop programs and standards specific to New York State.

Vice-President Michael Buck had an opportunity to work with several staff from Gardner Road School last week. It was very successful as the staff devised a plan on how to improve the school's academic rating so that the school is taken off the list. He wanted to recognize the members of the team and the hard work they perform on this Committee. He enjoyed the two days he spent with the Committee and is looking forwards to the report coming to the Board.

Board Member Mary Ann Holleran complimented the staff at Center Street Elementary School on the re-dedication of the Memorial Garden.

Board Member Mary Beth Frederick also complimented the staff at Center Street on the Memorial Garden. It was very well done. She also complimented Senior Justin Sun who has earned Semifinalist status in the 2010 National Merit Scholarship Program, placing him in the top one percent of students who entered the program. He'll find out later in the year if he has earned Finalist status

#### **Presentations**

#### **Gardner Road PTO Report**

Kim Walker, President of the Gardner Road Elementary School Parent Teacher Organization, updated the Board on the activities of the group. Some of the highlights of the Organization include fundraising(Tops Labels and Receipts which raised \$3,010 last year, Enjoy the City Coupon Book, Scholastic Book Sales and Clothing Sale. Key events of the Organization focus on students and families which includes Family Nights, the Fall Festival, the Ice Cream Social and Movie Night. Student Support includes the School Book Store, Food for Our Families, Gardner Road Readers, Summer Readers Pizza Party and the 4th Grade Celebration. Staff support includes Field Trips. Classroom Projects. Teacher Allocation, Math Madness Supplies and Staff Appreciation Week. School Support includes performances such as Tri-Cities Opera, Irish Dances. Purchases include items such as digital cameras and the sign for the school. Leadership Planning includes Year-End Planning Activities, Full Year Calendar Development, Fundraiser Plan, Events Coordination, Summer Meetings, Pre-PTO Meetings to guarantee a one-hour meeting. Kim thanked the Board of Education for its continual support of the students, staff and parents at Gardner Road Elementary School. President Brian Lynch thanked Kim for giving such an outstanding report and the PTO for the tremendous number of hours providing services to the Gardner Road School community.

#### Gardner Road School Presentation, "What Makes Gardner Road Great"!

Principal Mary Ann Suggs, along with teachers Kim Malone, Betsy Scanlon, Ginger Schirmer, Lorraine Packard and Madeline Hartman, presented a report on the School's Action Plan for the year. Using data and aliging their work with the District's strategic planning project, the Site-Based Team's goals for the year include improving communication, improving student success through vertical alignment and improving English skills.

Principal Mary Ann Suggs stated she is very proud of the diverse community that Gardner Road represents. There are 454 students and 56 staff members. The

ESL population is growing and 22%(almost one-quarter of the students) receive special education services. The 2009-2010 Action Plan was reviewed which consists of data driven based on the New York State Report Card, the District Scan and alignment with the Action and Strategic Plan. Major goals include: 1. Improving communication by piloting home school community folder, staff liaison with Site Based per grade level, better District-Wide Share Updates with staff, 2. Improve student success through vertical alignment, provide monthly strategies: ex. ELA at monthly meetings, 3. Improve ELA skills through the use of vocabulary for each grade level, the use of bookmarks at home and at school and the possibility of having an ELA night in the spring. The school also focuses on Community Service Projects such as monetary contributions of money by the staff, staff dress down days, staff raffles and candy and water sales. The school community leads by example such as the can collection of food for the Food Bank of the Southern Tier and the coat collection for the Salvation Army. The Character Education Program was presented. It consists of monthly traits/flip charts that are discussed on the morning news, the Big 5 was reviewed.

President Brian Lynch stated this was a great presentation. He thanked everyone present for being part of tonight's meeting. It is such an inspiration for the students the way the staff leads by example. He is very impressed with the dedication the staff has to the students at Gardner Road Elementary School.

Board Member Pam Strollo is also very impressed with the committee and all that the staff does to bring the diverse community of the school together. The understanding the staff has of the the families' needs and the contributions they make to them is amazing.

Superintendent Ralph Marino requested approval of October 23, 2009, be a Conference Day for Grades 7 and 8 only so that the Middle School staff can attend the New York State Middle School Association's Annual Conference. This conference is held every eight years and is held at a location close enough to the District so everyone can easily attend. This is a Conference Day for Middle School only.

#### **Update on DEC Report of Contaminated Soil**

The Board heard an update on the 1986 Department of Environmental Conservation report stating that a three-acre parcel of district property is the site of a former landfill. Scott Nostrand, from Barton and Loguidice, an environmental engineering firm, explained what the firm and the District has been doing to investigate and address the report. He said his firm has reviewed the report, along with aerial photos of the property from 1938 to 2002, and determined that the site in question is the District's existing paved fueling station and unpaved materials storage yard Bus Garage, not the athletic fields. He explained that without global positioning system technology in 1984 they could not pinpoint a site as accurately as possible as today. Overall, Scott stated there is no area of concern regarding the athletic fields as it was never used as a landfill. He stated at this point in time he does not recommend the need to have samples tested from the soccer or football fields. President Lynch requested the Board remain informed of the status of this situation.

#### **Assistant Superintendent's Report**

#### Summer Curriculum

Assistant Superintendent Alice Learn gave an update of curriculum work that was completed over the summer. Staff completed work on Site-Based Team training and planning, virtual learning experiences, foreign languages, physical education, Grades 5 and 6 assessments and maps, elementary and middle-level social studies, High School Participation in Government/Economics, High School Science, Elementary Math Benchmark Assessments, Middle and High School Math and Middle School English.

#### New York State Professional Development Standards

Assistant Superintendent Alice Learn reviewed the State handout on the standards and how they serve as a foundation for professional development in all schools across the State. She stated these standards were proposed in June

2009 and are the first of their kind. She stated there is another layer of what we call Performance Indicators that follow each of these. She shared these with the In-service Committee and what we are doing so that our programs always align to these standards and what our gaps are. The Professional Staff has looked at its use and used them for writing our Strategic Plan.

#### **Professional Development Update**

Assistant Superintendent Alice Learn discussed the District's Professional Development. Alice noted 54 teachers participated in professional development opportunities this summer. Of those 54, 15 were on-line courses, 27 were technology integration-related courses, 5 were Challenger Center programs and 16 were Response to Intervention programs. She also noted that two teachers, High School English Teacher, Bonnie Forrest, and Ridge Road Grade 2 Teacher, Kim Arnold, participated in more than five programs.

#### **Pre-K Through K Review Update**

Assistant Superintendent Alice Learn stated Dr. Sean Walmsley from the University at Albany Reading Department, who conducted the review, will be coming back to the District to lead a PreK/K student group from October to June. The goal of the study group will be to articulate a District-wide instruction philosophy for Pre-K and Kindergarten and to revise curriculum maps, assessments, and report cards as necessary to align instructional philosophy, expectations and core instructional practices and to create a seamless thread between Pre-K and K.

#### **Benchmark Assessments**

Superintendent Alice Learn stated an on-going conversation about Benchmark Assessments is occurring with all grade levels and departments. She stated Grade 3 teachers finished writing their four benchmark assessments for math yesterday.

#### **Report from the Visitation Committee**

Chair Rose Apgar reported on the Visitation Committee(Board Member Mary Beth Frederick and Mary Ann Holleran) visit to Gardner Road Elementary School on October 2, 2009. She commented regarding the excitement the third and fourth graders are experiencing with the creation of the Wild Thing that will be placed in or near the Library. She stated this is the fullest elementary school in the District this year. The fences were installed in the front of the building which prevents cars from being parked out back which means the grass does not get torn up nor does the playground equipment get damaged.
