President's Remarks

President Brian Lynch welcomed everyone to tonight's School Board Meeting and thanked High School Principal Karen Donahue and High School Librarians Peg Weidemann and Maureen Frei for hosting our meeting in the Library. Brian stated it is nice to have the opportunity to spend time in the Library and see how much it has changed over the years. He stated that the Board really enjoys traveling to the various schools and hearing what is occurring in the schools. Brian reviewed the guidelines for the Question/Comment Section which is next on the agenda. He stated Board Vice-President Dr. Michael Buck and Board Member Pam Strollo are absent tonight due to conflicts in their schedules.

Agenda Changes

President Brian Lynch stated Agenda Items 8 should be numbered as 8.1, 8.2 and 8.3, not 9.2 and 9.3. Agenda Items 9--9.1 and 9.2 will combine to be

Differentiated Accountability Information as presented by GST BOCES Grant Services. Also, there will be an Executive Session directly after tonight's Regular Session to approve CSE/CPSE/504 recommendations, discuss the employment history of three particular employees and a matter made confidential by state law.

Questions and Comments from the Public

Mike Skroskznik, 802 Center Street, voiced his concern involving Board Policy 0115, a Student Bullying Prevention and Intervention Program. Mr. Skroskznik inquired if this policy is a response from the new mandated law titled, "Dignity for All Student's Act?" Also, he asked if the Board has reviewed the law and understands students from Kindergarten to twelfth grade will be introduced to sexual orientation which defines heterosexuality, homosexuality and bisexuality? Also, does the Board of Education have a responsibility or concern regarding what material is used for an age appropriate version? Mr. Skroskznik stated that a teacher at the Middle School showed a forty-minute video, "Bullied" on heterosexuality, homosexuality, bisexuality and bullying without the parents being properly informed it was going to be shown. Mr. Skroskznik stated he felt that forty-minutes was too excessive for eighth graders and felt it was promoting the various sexual preferences to the students. Why weren't the parents notified in advance and given the opportunity to preview it and then make a decision if they wanted their child to view it? Board President Brian Lynch stated that the Board of Education did receive Mr. Skroskznik's letter of March 29th. Brian stated the proper procedure to follow is to meet with the individual principal involved and then if necessary meet with the Superintendent. Mr. Skroskznik commented that he did speak with the Assistant Principal at the Middle School and was not pleased with his replies; therefore, he will arrange a meeting with Superintendent Dr. Marino. Mr. Skroskznik invited Dr. Marino to a Parent Meeting that will be held on April 3rd, at 7:00 PM, at the American Legion located at 71 Old Ithaca Road, to discuss this law and to understand the curriculum being taught at the Horseheads Central School District.

They all earned at least one medal. Ralph thanked Coaches Rebecca Ross and Brian Steele and WENY Meteorologist John Hickey for leading the students to this success.

Board Member Mary Anne Holleran stated that last week she had the privilege of going to Ridge Road School and seeing the performance of "The Emperors New Clothes." The students gave an amazing performance.

Presentations

Brief "Sound Of Music" Performance

Members of the cast of "The Sound of Music" performed a preview of the show for the Board and the public. The show opened shortly after tonight's meeting began with three more shows to follow on Friday at 7:00 PM and Saturday at 1:00 PM and 7:00 PM. Board President Brian Lynch thanked the students for such an amazing performance.

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High School Presentation: “A Day at the High School”

High School Principal Karen Donahue, along with Social Studies Teacher Jamy Brice-Hyde, Librarians Peg Weidemann and Maureen Frei and Senior Paarth Shah presented information on the High School's efforts, goals and challenges.

High School Principal Karen Donahue stated that it was great that the Board had the opportunity to see our show. Karen stated the High School is always busy with several things constantly going on throughout the day. At any one time, you may see athletes coming in off the fields, students with make-up on getting ready for a performance and many, many other things that makes the High School unique. The High School is also unique because of the many opportunities that are available for the students. There is a broad array of electives, AP/ACE classes, performing arts, visual arts, lots of music and athletic programs available to the students. Karen stated the High School has a lot of staff who make the High School an exceptional place so that the students excel to their full potential. Karen stated the High School faces many challenges including the Common Core Standards and bringing them into alignment with the curriculum we use, College and Career Readiness and channeling their focus on literacy across the content areas to meet 21st Century Learning. Karen also stated that the Site Based Team aligned the work they did this year with the mission, vision and goals of the Board of Education.

Social Studies Teacher Jamy Brice-Hyde reported on how the High School promotes Academic Excellence, how the High School Culture has been improved and personalized and how the administrators work diligently do to this. Jamy stated that the High School wants to bring the community and the school closer together. She also stated that the Site Based Plan is a living document that continues to be worked on every month. Jamy stated that through the use of multiple web sites, use of the Library for various materials for Professional Growth to align to the Common Core and looking at data from previous testing and how to assimilate it towards academic growth the staff is able to promote Academic Excellence. The staff promotes a positive learning environment by looking at different aspects of how to reach our teenagers by looking at different ways to educate our students on what bullying is and to understand and learn what acceptable behavior is. Jamy stated that a lot of positive feedback is coming out of these conversations. Jamy also stated that the staff is promoting special things that other students may not be aware of and also positive things that the teachers may be participating in outside of the normal school day. The Site Based Team has worked very diligently to stay and focus on the District goals. The members are a very excited group of volunteers who work really hard to make the High School an excellent place to receive an education. Principal Karen Donahue stated that we realize the way to reach our goal is to look at Literacy in all the content areas which we believe we are doing throughout our curriculum. The challenges that we face will be met through the curriculum, programs and professional growth.

Librarians Peg Weidemann and Maureen Frei highlighted best practices, including how they're using the library to aid instruction through the use of book

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checkouts, reading, volunteering, research, questioning, copying displays, teaching and teamwork. It was noted that the Library is also used for professional development. During the fall semester, 2,011 Library classes were held. The Library is also used for college and career readiness, to research beyond content and specific learning for life in preparing students for the 21st Century.

Senior Paarth Shah gave the Board a student’s perspective of going through the Horseheads School system and also his experience at the US Senate Youth Program. Paarth stated the reason he has been accepted at Princeton is because of the staff at Horseheads. The values and morals that were instilled in him at a very early age in his home and as a Horseheads’ student have made him who he is today.

Board Member Mary Anne Holleran congratulated Paarth Shah for the pride he has brought to his parents, the school district and the community. She wished him the best when he begins his education at Princeton.

Board Member Mark Brinthaup stated this was an excellent presentation in all areas. Mark thanked High School Principal Karen Donahue and the High School Staff for their commitment to the students, staff and parents of the Horseheads community.

Board President Brian Lynch stated this was an excellent presentation. He further stated he is very fortunate to have had two daughters who have gone through the High School and another who will be a future student. Brian stated it is nice to know what is occurring at the High School and to see that the School is moving in the right direction. It is great to meet in the Library and to see how much it has changed. Brian thanked the staff for showing the Board the importance of Literacy and how crucial it is to learning. The movie the librarians presented added an excellent touch to the presentation. Brian wished Paarth the best and thanked him for making the District proud of him and for the great things that he has accomplished in his life at such a young age.

Assistant Superintendent's Report

Differentiated Accountability as Presented by GST BOCES Grant Services

Assistant Superintendent Alice Learn introduced GST BOCES Grant Specialist Jason Harmon who presented clarification on the grant services program and on the State's Differentiated Accountability Standards. Alice stated this is follow-up to Board Member Warren Conklin's inquiry from last month's Board meeting

regarding the Intermediate School Comprehensive Education Plan and clarification of Statement 1A, Item B of Form 4 – 10% of the Title 1 allocation. Jason stated that the reason for this designation is explained on Page 26 of the Plan. During the 2009-2010 school year, New York State awarded to implement accountability different than at the national level. We recognized and prioritized some of the supports made available. The phases are all the same as other states implementing the “No Child Left Behind Act”. Jason explained the Differentiated Accountability Model and stated that the School In Need of Improvement Model is a two-year document that is required to come out of the status of a school in need of improvement and that 10% of the allocation that was received had to be set aside for professional development. Board Member Warren Conklin inquired based on this vocabulary is the Intermediate School a “Basic” or “Focused” school. Jason stated the Intermediate School is a “Basic.” Board President Brian Lynch thanked Jason for clarifying differentiated accountability.

Strategic Plan Implementation Team Update

Assistant Superintendent Alice Learn provided the Board with an update on the Strategic Plan Implementation Team. Alice stated the group has been very busy this year and has reviewed all of the Strategic Intents, some of which have been brought to the Board for approval. The group is currently reviewing key Initiatives to identify new work for site teams and possibility district committees. The Character Education Committee is meeting regularly to develop a district-wide Character Education Program. The Green Task Force is continuing to meet to investigate how the District can become more environmentally conservative. The Implementation Team has decided to resurvey District staff and community beginning in November 2012. A survey sub-committee has been reviewing new editions of these surveys. They will also review their operational guidelines. Their last meeting of the year is May 19th. Board President Brian Lynch thanked Alice and members of the Strategic Plan for all of their hard work.
